- ~580 participants of ABACBS (BiocAsia conference was a satellite event from a this major Bioinformatics conference)
 - Monday student day, Tue-Wed ABACBS, Thur-Fri Bioc satellite event

- Con of having Bioc as satellite: if sitting through a main conference could be long and repetitive, combat that with having differences (type of presentations, types of questions)
- Bioc portion consisted of mostly workshops (R/Bioc and non Bioc like gpu) and research presentations (~60 participants)
- Davide and Belinda as keynotes
- How can we get more international participants?
- Hybrid conf (in-person + zoom).
- No Bioconductor Carpentries workshops have been held in Asia yet.
 - It is planned to change for next BioCAsia.
- How to decide where/how in future
 - Potentially needs more structure/steering committee to keep things moving
 - Hybrid/Satellites to broaden inclusion across Asia
 - Strong interest of having Caprenties workshop (Kozo)
 - The next host country will be chosen in January.
- Given the rising cost of travel, it's becoming more difficult to gather people for a single conference. Perhaps we should consider holding workshops in different Asian regions instead? (Hedia) Like How H3Africa

Conference feedback:

Lean towards not having one large conference that rotates. They like the diversity and decentral. They like spatially distinct locations and feel like it does not hinder community building as it makes it more accessible to regions.

Their view is there is a main conference in the US that is more distinct and that isn't a bad thing. The others formed naturally when there was a need and separate interests. Each conference has different formats and accessibilities.

Overwhelmingly they miss developer day and think it should return. That was originally what the "conference" was intended for and the focus on research has alienated developers.

Workshops need to be more "established" rather than focused on newer packages and a vignette demo.
